- Decreasing number of Regular Council Meetings
- Increasing number of Council Workshops no video records made,
 no public input allowed, however details are on the website
- Increasing number of council agenda items are consent-agenda items and thus offer no council discussion of issue
- Increasing number of council agenda items are **added** to consent-agenda **during** council meeting.
- Increased openness in that DNV reports are made available on DNV.ORG website in high quality publications

Note: Items highlighted in red are considered negative while items in green are considered positive news.

Recreational Needs Facilities

- Possible eventual removal of Griffin Facility
- Possible new facility at Delbrook but pool not assured
- Item was never put on referendum!

- Canexus (Chlorine Plant) Expansion/Modernization
 - Increase rail shipments to average of 32 rail cars/day
 - Reduce on-site fixed tank storage 300tons →60tons
 - Production of chlorine to be terminated July 1, 2030
 - Change of risk definition using societal instead of individual
 - Imposing more risk to other communities where railcars go
 - Stop shipping of dangerous goods (chlorine) thru WV after 2010

- Residential Taxes to increase 4.25% (really 6.25 since used surplus)
 Note: 5% increase for 30 years → Average taxes will be \$20,000/yr
- Home Alarm systems retain no fine for 1 false alarm/year
- Mayor foresees District Hall relocated to Lower Lynn
- Banning of single-use plastic and paper shopping bags delayed
- Block Watch Parties DNV fees waived free barricades
- Some fees (SPCA adoption) up 50%+, parking fines up 75%
- Illegal parking in disabled parking space: 55/77 tickets were SPARK holders! Tow-away by tow truck owners (without prior ticketing) is still a pending issue.
- Garbage now needs to be out at curb even earlier (7AM)

North Shore Police Services Review

- Phase 1 to be completed Fall 2008 to be released "soon"
- Need to renew or replace existing contract (expires 2012) next yr.
- Independent Community Survey done by RCMP March 27th deadline

Framework for Collaboration Protocol with School District⁽¹⁾

- DNV proposal adds to existing Joint Use of Facilities Agreement
- Addresses proposed school closures and land use changes
- Best stewardship of lands, facilities, and overall community health

- Marine Dr. priority curb bus lane only unto LGB
 - Single auto lane from bridge to West Vancouver

- Pesticides use banned for homeowners
 - Issue is really about banning use of 2,4-D for lawns
 - No bans imposed for Commercial and Industrial sites.
 - Pesticide use continues for Golf Courses
 - \$175 fine (but education first!) in effect Jan 1/2009

Note: Monetary issue important for business but assumed not of importance for property values for homeowners.

- Official Community Plan Review Process
 - Typical OCP ~100-200pages
 - Mayor Walton would like to see only ~10pages in plan


- DNV 2007 Annual Report (tabled 23 June 2008)
 - Lacked mandatory elements of measurables and key indicators

- Two important trends that may be troubling...
 - Dominance of mountain biking on walking/hiking trails
 - Increase in dog-off-leash use of parks

Both of these trends appear to disenfranchise existing users.

- Translink Transport 2040 Plan
 - North Shore pays ~\$6million/year in taxes to finance Plan
 - North Shore has low benefit relative to taxes paid
 - Translink not North Shore decides service levels
 - System unsustainable without huge increase in GVRD taxes (Councilor Hicks alleges that taxes may double in 5-6 yrs)
- More council debate was given the "dog regulation bylaw"

- Spirit (Walking/Biking) Trail: Deep Cove Horseshoe Bay(1-4)
 - Unlike WV and CNV DNV largely away from Waterfront
 - More slopes (>8% grade) of paths limits accessibility

Metro Vancouver Solid Waste Options


- Extend use at Cache Creek

- Skewed Committees lacking community representation
- Holding of closed meeting of Council contrary to Community Charter although there are indications this will no longer happen in the future.
- Lack of cost-benefit analysis in proposals (eg. bicycle lanes)
- More council "Workshops" fewer televised Regular Council meetings.
