Maplewood Local Plan

I am against the MLP insofar as it calls for major development & densification of the area without first addressing the major problem of traffic gridlock in & out of Seymour. Although optimists may point out that the twinning of the Dollarton Bridge will provide a solution, the District's Engineering department freely admits that this will not be the case.

From an environmental perspective, I encourage Committee members to be skeptical of claims made by the District's Planning Department. Previously, CanOxy's massive rezoning of land in Maplewood from industrial to 4 & 6 story office towers was supposed to include 'wildlife corridors'. Instead this issue was addressed by widening the boulevards along the realigned Dollarton Highway, which of course runs the wrong way & is useless in regards to the movement of wildlife.

The new Canadian Tire superstore & multi-restaurant development on the former site of Venice Bakery was supposed to include some 30,000 sq. feet of 'green space.' During the proceedings I specifically asked if this meant 30,000 square feet of 'dirt' and was told that this was to be the case. After Council approval, the 'green space' turned out to include sidewalks around the buildings & the perimeter of the site. In no shape or form will the site ever be considered 'green', unless one includes the 'garden centre' set up on a temporary basis by Canadian Tire.

Regrettably I believe the District's Planning Department is incapable of presenting any development proposal in a fair, unbiased & truthful manner. Until there is a major re-organization at District Hall, I believe this travesty will continue. I encourage Committee members to examine any proposals from the District with a very jaundiced eye.

I am writing on behalf of the Federation of North Vancouver Community Associations (FONVCA) to register our full support for Timothy Renshaw's position on N.V. District's Waterfront Task Force Report ("Watered down waterfront access" Jan. 17th NSN).



As an umbrella organization representing a broad coalition of community associations across the District, FONVCA would like to congratulate Mr. Renshaw on a very well researched, and reasoned article.

The Waterfront Task Force Report has been a source of much unfair controversy. Just prior to last year's municipal election, for example, the plan was deliberately misrepresented in high profile advertisements. As a result of these ads, District residents could be excused for wrongly believing that the plan advocated a concrete seawall, high-rise development, and property expropriation from Maplewood to Deep Cove. Unfortunately the municipality never made any effort to correct these falsehoods.

Mr. Renshaw accurately detailed the true intent of the waterfront plan. As his article pointed out, "The Waterfront Task Force Report is a worthy blueprint ... that deserves far more than just short term thinking."

#### **RE:** Waterfront Task Force Report

At the January 18th meeting of the Federation of N.V. Community Associations, the 11 associations represented around the table unanimously agreed to express to Council the view that only the short term items contained in the Waterfront Task Force Report (achievable in 0-5 years) need be addressed at this time.

FONVCA believes that Council risks becoming unnecessarily ensnared in a protracted discussion and debate over a plan with a 50-plus year time horizon. The Waterfront Task Force Report should be accepted in principle as a vision for current and future Councils to use as a guide for the development of public access to the waterfront.

As a long-term vision, the Waterfront Task Force Report is an invaluable document with years of study and public input behind it. While the plan offers future direction, it must be remembered that there is nothing in it that binds the hands of any Council.

FONVCA therefore suggests that Council now has an opportunity to focus its attention (with the upcoming meeting on the 29th) on identifying those specific items in the plan that are both acceptable and achievable in the near future. Making short-term decisions now on the fate of the plan's longer-term recommendations would be a major disservice to our municipality.

Dear Mayor \$ Council:

At the January meeting of the Federation of NV Community Associations the following motion was carried unanimously:

"THAT a letter be sent to Council requesting that community associations be given the first right of refusal to chair/co-chair Public Information Meetings and that all the usual arrangements be made by developer as is the current practice."

FONVCA believes that developer-sponsored Public Information Meetings amount to nothing more than a glossy "sales pitches" for proposed redevelopments. These meetings put developers in the awkward position of trying to appear neutral and informative, while the public in attendance often looks on with varying degrees of distrust.

In most neighbourhoods in the District, community associations have become the trusted vehicle for residents to express their views and opinions on issues of local concern. Rather than holding multiple meetings on any particular redevelopment proposal, the community association might wish to take advantage of the opportunity to either sponsor or co-sponsor with the developer the required Public Information Meeting. (The developer would still be responsible for the costs associated with the meeting, i.e. public notification and meeting room rental.)

For the developers, community association involvement in a Public Info Meeting would reduce the pressure to appear neutral and informative. Questions from the floor of such meetings would be directed by the CA Chair to either the developer or the District Planner in attendance. For members of the community, having their local community association sponsor Public Information Meetings would provide both initial neutrality and consistency at the early stage of the redevelopment process.

#### Dear Agnes Hilsen:

As you are well aware the Local Government Act allows the public to attend any Committee or task force meeting sponsored by the District. Therefore I question the ethics & legality of the 'secret' meeting between the Value Analysis Task Force & the Mayor on Tuesday February 6. Not only was this meeting not posted, a direct inquiry regarding the scheduling of the meeting by me was not replied to until after the fact. As Mr. Bell was aware of my attending every meeting of this body, I believe this was a shabby attempt to avoid public scrutiny.

On February 7, I also brought to your attention the fact that the Quality Assurance Committee meeting of February 9 was incorrectly posted as being held on February 16. I would also question the usefulness of the 'committee agenda' binder kept at reception as it seems to be very 'hit & miss' as to its contents. Mrs. Cathy Adams has also conveyed her concerns to me over the untimely updating & incompleteness of this binder.

Although I believe the QAC meeting was a careless oversight, I regard the transgression surrounding the Mayor's 'secret' meeting as a direct violation of the District's Code of Ethics & makes a mockery of the District's Model of Excellence.

In this regard, are there provisions in the Local Government Act that require public committees to post an announcement prior to holding a meeting & if so, how much advance notice is required?

This current state of affairs must be corrected. Therefore I suggest that if it is not already District policy, that any publicly sponsored District meeting can not take place unless properly posted at least 72 hours in advance. This should include all meetings, special interest or otherwise, unless specifically authorized under the Local Government Act.

#### By rights, the agenda should be posted at the same time.

Other examples: last week Mr. Masterton held a select meeting concerning the opening of Wye Street & the Maplewood Bird Sanctuary. Certain members of the Parks Committee were interested in this issue but were never informed nor was the general public. Last fall, the District held a meeting on repairing, removing or enlarging the Woodland's Dock. Although this was a District wide issue, only the residents of Woodlands were notified.

I hope you will give this matter high priority, as it concurs with what was discussed & endorsed at the recent workshop which District Council & staff attended at the Holiday Inn.

Subject: NVD Funding for the Arts

Dear Mayor & Council: Feb. 11, 2001

In regard to funding of the arts in North Vancouver District:

It was refreshing to hear Councillor Muri speak with vision in reminding Council of the success that Whistler has achieved in their municipality. We all know what a desirable place it has become and is reflected in its property values.

#### Has the District examined Whistler's policies and how they are administered?

I don't believe that there's any question that arts are under funded in North Van. The total subsidy for the arts in North Van District is \$8.75/per capita, compared with Vancouver's subsidy of \$14/per capita (GVRD statistics).

Mr.Bostwick mentioned the arts support group subsidy of \$87,000 based on \$1 per capita. If this formula is correct, then the Rec. Commission subsidy of \$6 million is \$68.96 per capita.

I concur with Mr. Young that the money used to fund Centennial Theatre should be considered as 'arts funding' but certainly not money used for arts & crafts classes or dancing lessons.

However no matter how one looks at it, the monetary funding between arts & recreation is disproportional.

To give the Feb.5th proposal full consideration, I believe Council should have reviewed District DCC's with those in neighbouring municipalities. It is my understanding that we are charging considerably less than the maximum. If correct, this would have been ample justification for charging a little something extra for the arts. A token ½% would have been better than nothing would.

I don't like the voluntary method, as I believe it will have the effect of 'softening' councillor's attitudes on variances and rezoning applications and in effect act as a bribe. All too often I have witnessed District Council go soft on development for very nebulous & unjustified reasons.

For over a <u>decade</u>, the District gave developers a 'free DCC ride' while other GVRD municipalities collected. Even though it was two years in the making, when it finally came before Council for adoption, implementation was delayed for another 8 months "to be fair to developers." Instead of charging DCC's to help pay for infrastructure, we used our Heritage Fund and lost millions & millions of dollars because of councillors who were soft on developers. I believe this is a major cause for the financial mess the District is in today.

- 2. Does anyone want to be responsible for monitoring the web agendas and notifying affected community associations?
- 3. What improvements could be made to the present system?
- 4. Does FONVCA want to consider requesting posting of minutes on the Web?
