2. ADOPTION of May 26th MINUTES

Moved/seconded Cathy/Dave and carried that the minutes be approved as circulated.

3. OLD BUSINESS

3.1 Alpine Recreation Strategic Study:

Now scheduled for June 21st 2005 - as requested – for a 7:00 pm start time, but there was a change of venue to 1370 Crown Street (District Yard). Brian to enquire as to why the change in location.

3.2 Dog Bylaw

This bylaw has been largely staff generated and noone spoke in favor of it at the public hearing. Councillor Jim Cuthbert has asked for reconsideration. The clerks office has advised Councilor Cuthbert to reconsider this bylaw, a new public hearing would be required. FONVCA motion requesting staff reconsider changing the boarding of animals regulations to:

- 1. No boarding permitted in residential zoned areas.
- 2. That there be a minimum 50 m. separation required between such commercial use and residential zoned areas. Corrie/John carried unanimously

3.3 Alarm Bylaw

Corrie updated members on this issue and no further action required unless it comes back to council.

3.4 Letter to Council re Waterfront Street-Ends

Discussed the follow-up letter from shirt sleeves meeting re: spending funding already designated for this use. Two responses from Councilors Nixon and Walton - both positive.

3.5 FONVCA meetings for summer months

It was decided to defer cancellation of the August meeting until after FONVCA's July meeting. Likely to be cancelled unless new issues make an August meeting necessary.

4. CORRESPONDENCE ISSUES

4.1 Business arising from 51 regular emails – 30 on the Mountain Biking issue. No discussion.

4.2 Non-posted letters

There were 10 non-posted letters. **ACTION:** One will be posted after Brian has checked with James Ridge - nine will not be posted.

5. NEW BUSINESS

- **5.1 June 8/9 open houses held on Lower Capilano Community Centre** Cathy/John reported the project has been scaled down to 13,000 sq. ft. from the proposed 18,000 sq. ft. No second floor greater setbacks from lane and road requiring greater impact on sports field. Not acceptable to most of the original committee. Will go back to council in July for additional funding.
- **5.2 DNV 2004 Annual Report** Corrie has a copy of the report and it is also on the web presentation style better than last years but it still lacks key indicators statistics. No basis for comparison with last year. No specific time for public input before going to council June 27.
- **5.3 Development Variance application** Eric Blueridge C.A. was asked for comments on an application that did not yet contain all of the specific information on the variance. He was concerned when, contrary to the usual practice, staff later advised that the variances for this application could set a precedent for the area. **ACTION:** Brian to write to council requesting Community Associations and the immediate neighbours not be contacted for comments until the relevant information with actual size of variances is available.

- **5.4 55+ housing survey** Eric questions the validity of the results of a private survey requesting responses from readers of the N.S.N. by a Real Estate agent.
- **5.5 2005 Canada Building Code** Corrie expressed concerns that all district buildings currently in development process would not be constructed to the latest proposed revised building codes (which have more stringent earthquake requirements).
- **5.6 Sale of GVRD Parkland** Corrie GVRD are selling 40 acres of "surplus" parkland of Crippen Regional Park on Bowen Island for 2 million dollars and are using the **alternate approval process which would require 140,125 signatures** to force the holding of a referendum on the sale of parkland issue

ACTION: Motion - an open letter to be sent to District Council, MLA'S and NSN. This illustrates that the counter petition process – using the 10 % rule does not work and could be used in other sales of parkland. Corrie/John - carried

5.7 Bear Bylaws - many concerns were expressed on the proposed Enhanced Garbage Management Bylaw by Councilor Cuthbert agenda item at meeting Monday 20 June.

6. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- **6.1 Legal Issues:** Corrie referred to item listed in agenda.
- **6.2 Transportation -** Cathy the transportation department presented to Marine Drive Improvement Committee the proposal to put a combined bike/bus lane on both sides of Marine Drive from Capilano Rd. to City of N. Vancouver
- this is contrary to past recommendations made by this group.

Corrie - the province is proposing to revisit connecting the Upper Levels Highway with the Lions Gate Bridge. Three routes proposed, Taylor Way, along Capilano River or Capilano Rd.

6.3 Council Remuneration - John Hunter - as a member of the committee John gave an over-view of the process arriving at the \$85,000.p.a. for the mayoral position and \$34,000 p.a. for councilors (40% of the Mayors salary) and both to be indexed annually. As is current practice, councilors to get \$1,000 a week extra when serving as the Mayor. Agenda item at Council Meeting June 20

- **6.4 Newspaper Box Location:** Corrie gave a handout outlining the technical measurements which determine the locations where newspaper boxes may be located.
- **6.5 New Development Servicing Bylaw** Marcel Bernier section manager Engineering Design Services requested to present the draft bylaw to FONVCA, this will be arranged for the July 21 meeting.

Mayor & Council:

At the June 16th meeting of the *Federation of NV Community Associations*, a discussion took place over the process for soliciting feedback on Development Variance Permits.

Community associations and no doubt adjacent neighbours appreciate being notified of individual DVPs at the earliest stage of the development process. The only problem with this process is that all the information necessary to determine if an application amounts to any concern is not revealed until after the final report to council has been prepared. The result is that the report to council usually indicates no response to the application.

A recent DVP that came to Council is a good example. The initial letter from staff that went out to the adjacent neighbours and the local community association stated that a variance was in process, but the letter could not indicate any specifics because the plan checkers had yet to review the application in detail. There was no indication that the variance in question would amount to anything significant and therefore no feedback was received. The final staff report to Council, however, made it abundantly clear that if the DVP was approved against staff's advice, it would then be used as a precedent for other applications in the neighbourhood.

As a result of the above, FONVCA respectfully requests that the notification process for Development Variance Permits be amended so that adjacent neighbours and the relevant community association are not officially polled for comment until all the relevant information with respect to the actual size of each variance is made available.

Re: Open letter to Provincial Ministry of Community Services and the GVRD Regional Parks Board.

The Federation of North Vancouver Community Associations, an umbrella organization representing 18 registered community associations in the District of North Vancouver, wishes to express its concern over the manner in which some 40 acres of Crippen Regional Parkland is being sold to the Bowen Island Municipality for its own uses. The land in question is owned by Electoral Area "A" and all GVRD member municipalities. Instead of seeking the assent (by way of referendum) of the electorate, the GVRD is using the mechanism of the "alternative approval process."

Already felt to be an extremely difficult standard to meet for large municipalities, the "alternative approval process" sets an essentially impossible requirement for a region the size of the GVRD. The minimum number of registered voters required to respond to a petition, and therefore force a referendum, would be 10% of 1,401,250 which equals 140,125 electors. Each petitioner must file on a separate sheet of paper, the total number of which must either be delivered or mailed in within 30 days. This number of petitions, if placed in a single pile, would form a stack of some 46 feet in height. In our judgment this constitutes such an onerous requirement that it makes a mockery of the democratic process. On the North Shore we have the Capilano Regional Park. Using this process the GVRD could sell any part of it and even if all the voters of the three North Shore municipalities signed the counter-petitions they could not muster 140,125 signatures.

In a letter, dated August 11, 2003, to the Ministry of Community, Aboriginal and Women's Services (Hon. Ted Nebbeling at that time) the *Federation of North Vancouver Community Associations* strenuously objected to the new provisions in the Community Charter which would allow for such an onerous "alternative approval process" with the 10% requirement. Formerly this had been 5% and had never been applied to situations encompassing multiple municipalities. Even the UBCM, after an extensive survey, had recommended retention of the 5% requirement for municipalities.

In summary there are several aspects to this issue which are of concern:

- 1. **The sale:** This sale, if approved by the GVRD board members, will set a precedent for sell-off of any parkland, for any reason, throughout the province.
- 2. **Sale price:** The sale price of \$2 million appears to be extremely low for almost 39 acres. What would be fair market value, as established by realtors and sales in the area?
- 3. **Democracy:** Bowen residents the purchasers being offered this attractive deal were allowed a full referendum to authorize the funding necessary for the land purchase. GVRD residents who collectively own that parkland were not allowed a voice on April 30th.
- 4. **Democracy and accountability:** The well-nigh impossible hurdle which the Community Charter [CC] has set for the counter-petition process is a poison-pill for democracy. During the drafting of the wording of the CC, the *Federation of North Vancouver Community Associations* protested the original CC requirement of 5% of electors on the basis that the hurdle was too onerous. Response of the provincial government? Up it to 10%!
- 5. Lack of transparency: GVRD kept the negotiations at a very low profile until, as required by the CC, an advertisement of the

counter-petition had to appear in the papers.

6. "Surplus" parkland: Most important of all is this question: Since when has any park in this province been "surplus?" What of future generations? Is this sustainable development?

There are many other distasteful aspects of this proposed deal, but before they are addressed, some of the information needs to be amplified, in order that the picture can be verified as to its completeness and accuracy.

What needs to be done? If you share these concerns......

Approach the resolution of this issue on 3 fronts:

- Disposal of this parkland must be by way of a referendum by all affected citizens.
- Require that the sale of parkland be fully disclosed to all GVRD taxpayers what plans Bowen has for the land, or what the GVRD plans to do with the \$2-million; and,
- The critical need for amendments to the Community Charter.

If you believe the foregoing has merit, then please take immediate action to urge your local Council and your GVRD Board representative to reject this proposal unless and until a full referendum has been held throughout the GVRD – preferably in concert with the upcoming November '05 Civic Elections.. Further, it is important that the provincial government be urged to review the wording of the Community Charter, particularly with respect to the referendum/counter-petition process.

Most critical of all, in the short space of time available before July 8th, members of the GVRD Board need to be made fully aware of the implications of this proposal – now and for the environmental future of this province.

In view of the tight timeline, your early reaction would be appreciated.

Dear FONVCA:

The District has been working over the past several years to complete the new Development Servicing Bylaw, which is intended to replace the current Subdivision Bylaw No.2169. The bylaw has been underway as a joint Planning/Engineering project, with input from other departments, and is now ready for review. As a first step, we are planning to hold discussion workshops with some of the key groups, including FONVCA. The workshops will provide an overview of the bylaw content and purpose, and provide an opportunity for questions and comments. It is likely that changes will be made to the draft bylaw in response to this early input. We then anticipate reviewing the draft bylaw with Council at a future policy session, likely in September, before it is given first reading.

The bylaw is a very lengthy technical document which establishes District standards for water, sewer, roads, drainage etc. at the time of subdivision or development, and a session of 1-2 hours will probably be needed. We will be posting the draft bylaw on the District web-site early next week, and CD copies of the draft will also be available. Hard copies are also available if required.

Could you advise me whether you would like to review the bylaw at your normal meeting time (3rd Thursday or July 21), or whether another meeting date would be preferred (late June or early July)?
