3.2 CANLAN AGREEMENT (Ice Rink)

The District says our taxes are to rise 3.98%. However this does not convey the full story. The total budget is \$114,249,829 of which our municipal taxes contribute \$56,183,625. The rest is made up in Service Charges and User Fees and some (net) \$13,276,165 transfers from surplus, reserve, and heritage funds.

In effect, if we did not use up these savings, the bulk of which came from selling district land, the taxes would need to increase a further 23.6%. Clearly we are living beyond our means and the current situation is not sustainable.

Looking at the proposed budget for year 2006 we see that the net transfer from surplus, reserve, and heritage funds has essentially dropped to zero. That is the good news. The bad news is that, despite a drop of \$6.3Million in expenditures on Parks/Recreation/Culture, our taxes will have risen by a further 12.9%, and service charges and fees by 11.1%.

Council needs to wake up to the reality of the situation. We **must** reduce our expenditures. A core review of each department should be done starting immediately – with scenarios put forth corresponding to 10, 20, and 30% cutbacks. The public needs to be heavily involved in making some serious choices on these core services with council taking a strong leadership in bringing our expenses under control. Failure to take these steps, will, in my opinion, lead to dire consequences.

In the worst case scenario we could once again see the mass sell-off of public property with the eventual destruction of our forests, and ultimately, our way of life and the reasons we moved and stayed here. The responsibility lies in your hands. Please act now.

MAYOR ANNOUNCES CHANGE IN NORTH VANCOUVER DISTRICT SENIOR MANAGEMENT

North Vancouver, B.C

North Vancouver District Mayor Don Bell announced effective May 2, 2003 Council has approved a change in senior management at the District. Gord Howie, employed as Municipal Manager since May 1996, will no longer hold a position with the municipality.

Mayor Bell said "the new Council has embarked on a strategic planning process to set its vision and goals for the community for both the short and long term." A daylong facilitated planning workshop for Council and senior staff was held in early April. Bell stated further, "After careful consideration, Council has determined that a change in administrative leadership would be beneficial as we move forward."

Council also endorsed Mayor Bell assuming Chairmanship of the Senior Management Committee (Directors Team) during the transition period and taking a more active and "hands-on" role in directing the administration of the District.

Mayor Bell further stated his appreciation for the seven years of service Mr. Howie has provided to the municipality during which time numerous improvements to the administration and organization of the District were instituted, and the Mayor further offered best wishes to Mr. Howie in his future endeavours.

Proposal to switch from paper to clear biodegradable plastic

I am reminded of the famous "let them eat cake" quote. I see a proposal to investigate biodegradable clear plastic bags as yet another way to delay the obvious - that is, the need to



simply go back to using economical, clear plastic bags (see adjacent picture showing large, tear resistant clear plastic bags now costing under \$10 for 70, ie. less than 15cents each compared to 60cents each or more for paper bags).

Last year's switchover from clear plastic to paper was environmentally dubious at best and certainly economically unsound. Any **credible** polling of district residents would have garnered little support for the switch to paper bags. To switch to an even more expensive solution – biodegradable plastic would only exacerbate the downloading unto our residents. Note that the only biodegradable plastics known to work are almost

twice the price of paper and are NOT clear.

Despite what appears to be recent and timely North Shore News "setup" articles in support of our current recycling program, the District should also consider doing away with the separate and costly recycling department and integrate their functions into the District's overall solid waste disposal/recycling service.

I suggest that the motion on the table should be simply to revert back to clear plastic bags. They should be left untied (as they are for example in Delta), dumped, and returned for recycling and/or re-use by placing them near or in the blue-box. This ensures the collected yard trimmings are neither contaminated by plastic nor by undesirable material that can currently be hidden in the paper bags. I suggest council request a staff report on the economics of such a proposal – and possibly that of also doing away with the separate external recycling agreement.
