Easy weatherization steps such as caulking and sealing can achieve energy savings of more than 25 per cent, resulting in lower energy bills, a more comfortable home and reduced greenhouse gas emissions. Even greater savings can be realized through retrofits such as window replacements, insulation and high-efficiency furnaces.

In West Vancouver, single-family homes are responsible for over half of GHG emissions; in the District of North Vancouver, buildings produce about 50 per cent of the community's GHGs. We can all take action to reduce these numbers, and make every neighbourhood a cool neighbourhood.
