
As **Agenda item #6 of November 5th 2001** Council dealt with financial options of funding GVWD for the years 2002 to 2007. The 9% /year increase is COMPOUNDED and the financial impact should have been more clearly illustrated as I have shown below. (**2001 Water rates were \$237**)

One sees that choosing the "pay as you go" option results in a saving of over \$100 per household over the years 2002-2007. Fortunately this was the choice council made – although it was not based on the "facts" shown above. Rates following the year 2007 were not provided (except "that they are expected to be relatively flat after"). The staff report that option A (9% increase/year) would see a saving of \$50million in interest payments appears to be at odds with the total cost to the taxpayers over the years being discussed! So it appears that "blind luck" triumphs again.

So in summary, the projected water rates endorsed by Council will see them rise from the current \$237/year to \$418/year by 2007 (an increase of some 76%).
