Grants usually amounted to one third > of the land construction costs. > > The Act was repealed to remove barriers and conditions regulating sale, > change in use and other transactions involving senior's housing and care > facilities that were partially funded through grants under the Act. > > According to the letter signed by George Abbott the Minister of > Community, Aboriginal and Women's Services, the repeal is being supported > by the British Columbia Non-Profit Housing Associations, which represents > many of the societies owning properties developed under the Act. > > Notwithstanding it behooves Council to request a staff report as to > whether this change will have any impact on Seniors Housing in the > District, to what extent and what those implications are if nay. > > >
