The waste and recycling policies in B.C. are fundamentally flawed since > the one element which makes any waste and recycling policy successful is
> lacking. This is legislation compelling manufacturers to accept a certain $>$ percentage of recyclable material in the production of new products.

Such polices are in place in all western countries including in the US.
> From this folly derive all subsequent follies and shortcomings in our
$>$ waste and recycling material collection including the one you are
> describing. This is to say there can be no meaningful waste reduction > unless legislation as outlined above is in place.
> This is the one message that was driven home to us when we attended an
> international waste conference in Berlin many years ago at the expense of
> taxpayers. This fundamental tenet is still in place. Our waste reduction
> polices apart from being unnecessarily expensive and bureaucratic are > essentially make believe policies causing considerable inconvenience and > even hardship to many residents. However, none of this is the fault of > our sanitation crews who are merely doing what they are told.
> I have consistently pointed to completely different solutions based on policies that have led to success in other jurisdictions including the US > but without success.
> I will send a copy of this letter to both Council and staff.
