Since the letter was addressed to Mayor and Council requesting action, I
went to the trouble of putting this request into the form of a motion to
be dealt with by Council. This occurred last night and the item was
debated as part of the Council Agenda. It is during that debate that you
informed Council and the public that Staff is dealing with this matter
already.

> This is curious since the request from this citizen is recent and is

> specifically directed to the Mayor and Council. In any case, I consider

> remarks of that nature on your part completely inappropriate. This is not

> the first time that you have done this.

>

> Since there is no way for any member of Council to know that staff is > already working on an item, I would like to suggest that henceforth, you

> indicate to the initiator of such a motion ahead of time either that the

> item is already being dealt with by staff and/or that you refrain from

> inferring that further action is unnecessary.

>

If your staff is indeed working on an item, then you should so indicate
ahead of time. There is plenty of time (approximately 3 weeks) between the
time such a motion is submitted and the time it appears on the Agenda. As
it is, I doubt very much whether Staff was indeed working on this matter
since this is a brand new request and since the appeal for action was
addressed to Mayor and Council directly.

>

> As for Council, this issue proves once again that such matters should be
> dealt with under correspondence and any business arising therefrom exactly
> as I suggested. This is what other municipalities are doing and it seems
> to me that, in line with sound business practices, we should do the same.
