Hi Bill - no I don't recall saying that the Edgemont Community Association was entitled to \$2,000. Actually I don't know what we would get out of the Healthy Neighbourhood Fund since we have never applied for money. Our Association is self funding; we have a voluntary \$5 annual membership dues (per household) for those people who sign up on our membership list. That money is used to pay the meeting room cost (\$35), photocopying and stationary. It seems to work well for us because by the time our AGM rolls around, our account is getting pretty low. Nevertheless, you are correct that we would receive more money from the fund since our boundaries encompass all of Upper Capilano -- about 5,000 homes.
