## **REVISED**

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> Closing of Lynn Valley Community Policing Center
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> A MESSAGE FROM ERNIE CRIST:
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> The Lynn Valley Community Policing Center presently located in the Lynn
> Valley Mall will be closed as funding of the North Vancouver District's
> Police Budget has been cut by 1.35%. There was no seconder to a motion
> made by Councilor Crist to restore the $ 140.846 needed to keep the
> facility open. Crist stated that, closing this facility means a 180
> degree turn in priorities for the District which had undertaken to
> expand the Community Policing program as the central piece of the
> preventive and extremely effective community policing program.
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>
> Crist pointed out that while Lynn Valley is being closed, Council is
> contemplating opening a Community Policing Facility similar to Lynn Valley
> in Seymour. An appropriate amount is in the 2002 District Capital Budget
> ready for approval by Council. Crist is the only Councillor who resides in
> Lynn Valley. He stated that it did not make sense to close Lynn Valley
> while opening other facilities especially since Lynn Valley was the area
> with the most crime related problems and the greatest population of
> any neighborhood in the District.
>
> Crist has repeatedly pointed out that the District could improve its
> financial posture, among other things, by ending its present subsidies to
> the City. Under the current joint services agreemen between the City and
> the District, the District pays 100% of all capital maintenance costs for
> all District Recreation facilities including playing fields. The City's
> population is more than half that of the District. Crist has claimed
> repeatedly that the present arrangement between the two municipalities for
> the use of recreational facilities and playing fields is unfair to
> District taxpayers and that ending this policy would free up large funds
> for other purposes.
