> Rationale:
> Mr. William Cassidy, a District resident, requested a breakdown of
> expenses by the BC Assessment Authority for the North Shore (including
> the District of North Vancouver), Squamish Valley Office Levy and Expense
> Comparison for 2001 and 2002.

> Mr. Cassidy requested the information under the Freedom of Information Act
> (FOI) and has now received this information from Mr. Graham Duggan, BC
> Assessment Information and Privacy Officer.
> The information reveals that District residents, along with the other
> residents of the North Shore Squamish Valley communities, pay a portion of
> the total BC Assessment expenses far in excess of their portion of
> population. An expense comparison for 2002 versus 2001 alone reveals that
> the North Shore Squamish Valley Office expenses in 2002 increased by 1.773
> % over 2001. However, the charges against the North Shore Squamish
> communities increased by 4.195 %.
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> > But the information reveals not only that the expenses charged to these > communities relative to their population are much higher than those > charged against the rest of the Province, it also reveals that the > expenses allocated to North Vancouver District residents in relation to > the other communities on the North Shore and Squamish Valley communities > are much higher. For example, while the North Shore Squamish Valley > expenses for 2002 are given as \$ 2,967.200, the expenses levy to North > Vancouver District residents is \$ 1,498.827 or 50.1513% of this amount > while the levy collected by the District of North Vancouver for the BC > Assessment Authority is merely 25.411 % of the total amount of \$ > 5,898.419. > > It behooves Council on behalf of the District residents to request the BC > Assessment Authority to end this discrimination and to bring this matter > to the attention of the Provincial Government. > > > > >



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
