> Subject your letter re taxes:
>
> You have asked why the steep property tax increases in the District in
> the last few years.
>
> You may be aware that the provincial government has downloaded much of its
> responsibilities onto local government. This is reason number one. You
> may also be aware that Crown Corporations such as BC Rail and others have
> not been paying their fair share of taxes which means a loss of many
> millions of dollars to the District. Having said this, it is also true
> that the District is not efficiently run. This was confirmed in more than
> one study by outside consultants, including KPMG.
>
> In addition, the District is subsidizing the City of North Vancouver to a
> large extent. They are building the high-rises and we are building the
> soccer fields for them free of charge. Also for every single recreation
> facility they have, we have four, yet they do not contribute a single cent
> to the capital maintenance of our facilities which are used liberally by
> city citizens.. This too constitutes a huge subsidy courtesy of the
> District taxpayers. All my efforts to change this have failed.
> And yet another reason for the present situation is that instead of
> allowing the District Heritage Fund to accumulate and use the interest for
> capital projects as was planned, we have used up the principle to
> subsidize our operations. This too is unbusinesslike and has backfired.
> We have also accessed District reserve funds which means that here too we
> will have to pay for replacing our old worn out infrastructure out of
> taxes instead of the reserves, which was originally planned. All in all
> the District has been poorly managed and the result is that your taxes
> have gone up more than in any other municipality in the Region bar none.
> It is also the reason why they will continue to go up in the coming years,
> unless, of course, there are changes. The main reason, however, is that
> the public, with the exception of a few people such as yourself, does not
> seem to care.
> After having been in office for 22 years, this is the way I see it.
