1 Scheduled Delegations

1.1 Delegations are scheduled by the Clerk after receipt of a request submitted in writing and addressed to Mayor and Council.

1.2 If a delegation request concerns a matter previously decided by Council or concerns an issue which is being or has been dealt

with in public participation process, the delegation's request to appear before Council may be placed on the appointed agenda for


Council direction.

With reference to the above Section of Policy 1-0570-4, concerning items that have previously been dealt with by Council, where Council approval is needed for this delegation to be received, I am requesting that you forward your report regarding the request of Mr. John Van Luven to appear as a delegation, considering that this item has already been dealt with by Council on Monday, July 15, 2002.
