> Motion - Regulations of Hours of Business - Report Councillor Crist
> That the Council of the District of North Vancouver follow the example of the Council
of the District of West Vancouver and send a letter to Community groups including FONVCA
and Business Association groups as well as the North Vancouver Chamber of Commerce to
request input regarding the regulation of Hours of Business in the District of North
Vancouver and further
> that the City of North Vancouver be invited to do likewise.
> Rationale:
>
> In January, the Provincial Government will be enacting the new Community Charter. This
Charter will be replacing parts of the existing Local Government Act and bring many
changes as to how municipalities can foster the economic, social and environmental well
being of their communities. In addition, the Provincial Holiday Shopping Act has been
repealed leaving greater flexibility for regulating business hours on Sundays and
Holidays.
> Included in these changes are the ability to regulate the hours of business, not only
broadly within a Municipality, but also for different classes and business areas. What
this means is that different areas of the District could have different hours of
business operations. Additionally, certain types of businesses could also have
different hours of operation. The Charter will permit the District of North Vancouver
design more flexible regulations if it so wishes so as to better balance neighborhood,
business and community needs.
> On the other hand, Council may not wish to interfere and leave this matter entirely in
the hands of the market. This may be difficult, however, since it raises a whole number
of other related issues.
> However, notwithstanding the above, this issue should be presented to the community
for feedback. It may also be advantageous to determine a common policy with the City or
at least explore and exchange ideas before any possible unilateral steps are taken by
either municipality.
