Mayor Bell,

I agree entirely with Mr. Andersen's complaint against your (once again) unbalanced application of the prescribed Code of Ethics. At last night's Council meeting, Councillor Nixon launched what was in my view an attack on the dedicated volunteers who served on the planning committee for the Seymour OCP. Beginning with the comment that the committee was not formed through the "grassroots," he went on to say that those people who provided countless hours of their time serving a public cause were merely "survivors" who comprised nothing more than a "special interest group." These derogatory comments were allowed to stand without challenge.
