Dear Mr. Pollard.

I have been a staunch supporter of a "Pedestrian Oriented Town Center" and civic square in Lynn Valley including a new Library for a long time.

The problem is that the Lynn Valley "Pedestrian Oriented Town Center" as promised in the Lynn Valley Community plan turned out NOT "pedestrian oriented " but merely a densification of the existing Lynn Valley Core area, complete with more traffic, more parking problems, more pollution and more noise. The designated bicycle lanes and the green pedestrian areas shown on the glossy brochures when the Lynn Valley Community Plan was sold to the public turned out to be an empty promise.

The question now is NOT whether or not a Library as part of the civic square project should be built or not, but whether or NOT we will build it with our own money including that already approved by the public via a public referendum plus the proceeds from land sales already in place or whether we will allow private developers to assist in the financing of this project in exchange for an even greater densification of the area which would include at least five high-rises.

The other issue is what kind of Library? One that is based on the old and outdated concept of libraries of yesterday where clients merely pick up and return books OR a modern information and communication center big enough to also accommodate small scale cultural, social and community events - a meeting place where people may listen to special performances of music, plays, readings, lectures and partake in debates - in other words an information, communication as well as a cultural hub to stimulate cultural and intellectual curiosity as I have proposed?
