I am no expert in this matter but density per se is likely not the problem. A stronger correlation likely exists with the socioeconomics of the population - which may be lower for higher density areas. A proper GIS study, taking into account the various socioeconomic factors would provide a more objective answer. The statistics on theft can also be heavily biased by just a few determined criminals - who are often responsible for most of these crimes. Of course there may well be more crimes in the District as a result of densification in the City of North Vancouver. Again, we need to look more closely at the data. Things are not always so simple and clear cut.

> The RCMP in North Vancouver have been busy investigating a rash of
> thefts from vehicles. These thefts are mostly occurring from the
> Lonsdale Quay all the way up the 29th Ave. They are also occurring in
> the area of Chesterfield Ave. The suspect is entering underground
> parkades of businesses and homes and breaking into numerous cars at each
> location.

> This crime is a crime of opportunity for most criminals and is quite
> often an act of desperation to support a drug habit. Thieves will look
> for personal belongings left in your car such as wallets, bags,
> clothing, computer equipment, change and even empty cans and bottles.
> Police want to remind the public to ensure that nothing is left in your
> vehicle including your insurance papers which contain your personal
> details on them. Even in an underground, secured parking lot your
> vehicle should be locked with its alarm system activated. Do not leave
> remote controls for your garage door in your car as this may easily give
> the thief an opportunity to come back. Be extremely vigilant when
> entering your garage or underground parkade and ensure that the door
> shuts behind you without letting another party inside. If you spot a
