The Clerk has rightly noted that section 118 was not in the Draft Charter Document. However, staff must have been aware of the Third Reading of Bill 14 (Community Charter) that took place on May 8th of 2003 - about 10 months ago, in which this section was already included. I was certainly aware of this requirement. I am thus somewhat perplexed about paragraph 3 on page 3 of the report by the Municipal Clerk.
