Dear Mayor, Councillors, and Staff of DNV:

Please read the following study which includes the effects of mountain biking on our forested areas. This can be applied to our deer and black bears.

Also, in the light of the findings of the Alpine Recreational Strategic Study, there is no need to open Mountain View Park to mountain bikes, and the trails should be for hiking only. While the RPO has been in effect, it has slowed down mountain bikes and commercial dog walkers coming into the park. The traffic will increase if a bike trail is built.
