Dear DNV Communities: We have one of the biggest district plan coming near an end that will change the face of our forests for the worst, and leave a poor legacy for the next generation, as there is <u>no opposition</u> to the whims and wiles of the DNV Alpine Planning Staff in conjunction with the NSMBA greedy wants. A total of 35 comment sheets were given back from a recent Alpine workshop where 74 people attended (Sept. 29th).
