In response to your question re Community Charter authority to expel persons from meeting for improper conduct, this will confirm my advice that this same authority was previously provided in the Local Government Act (Section 242.5 "Expulsion from meeting for improper conduct". The wording is essentially the same, but the Community Charter added a phrase authorizing a peace officer to enforce the order if the person who is expelled doesn't leave the meeting.
