A MESSAGE FROM ERNIE CRIST - An undeniable denial?

According to today's 'North Shore OUTLOOK, District Councillor Lisa Muri vehemently denied that she was endorsed by the Concerned (for themselves) Citizen Association, a civic party comprised of a special interests group specifically formed to defeat the District of North Vancouver Waterfront Task Force recommendations put forward by a Council Appointed Citizens Task Force.

The Task Force had recommended that the District owned waterfront be made accessible to the public. The CCA vowed to defeat any member of District Council who voted in favour of implementing the recommendations which envisioned the construction of a walkway along the public owned foreshore over a period of 50 years. The result was that Councillors, Trevor Carolan, Glynnis Dearing-Robb and Pat Munroe who were on District Council and had voted in favour of the recommendations were defeated. Veteran Councillor Ernie Crist, the only other member NOT endorsed by the CCA came within 150 votes of being defeated as well.

Lisa Muri, following her re-election voted consistently against any and all recommendations contained in the Task Force Report. When asked to comment about Lisa Muri's denial Crist said, "if it walks, quacks, and has feathers like a duck .....the rest you know yourself" he said.
