Subject: Capilano Lake Water Level

Dear Mr. Mazoret:

Your inquiry regarding the low level of Capilano Lake has been forwarded to me for response. You are correct in your assumption that the low lake level is due to GVRD work. They have lowered the lake level in order to repair seals on the dam drum gate, which is the mechanism that controls the level of water above the dam spillway.

I spoke with the GVRD last Friday on this matter. They don't have serious concerns yet about the ability of the lake level to recover in time for summer, however it may be a problem should we have a dry spring. They will be monitoring the situation closely as spring and summer approach, and will keep municipalities informed of the water supply situation on an ongoing basis.
