A MESSAGE FROM ERNIE CRIST

I attended the DNV all Candidates meeting in Parkgate on Saturday October 29. I did so the very first time as an observer rather than a candidate as I have done for the last 30 years. For, although I have been in office for 25 years, I ran unsuccessfully several times before I got elected. I confess it felt a little odd. I wondered how I managed for so many years to do what all the hopefuls were trying to do at this meeting. There were something like 27 Candidates including Mayoralty Candidates, District Councillors, Councillor hopefuls and candidates for the School Board.

I confess that with the exception of a few, the majority of the candidates for District Council did not appear to really understand the issues and did not really seem to have any answers to the many complex problems municipalities face in this modern

He had always been in favour he said and he did not even blush or seemed to be embarrassed.

Another incumbent claimed that the redevelopment of Lynn Valley, the so called "Pedestrian Oriented Town Center", was a great success when indeed it is one of the biggest fiscal, environmental, cultural, social and community planning fiascos and hoaxes that has ever been perpetrated on the residents of any community. It is amazing what you can tell the public if you assume that they understand as little as you do.

There were some promising voices nonetheless and we will undoubtedly hear more from them. I sincerely hope that the voting public will be able to separate truth from fiction and the wheat from the chaff.
