I listened with interest tonight to the presentation of B C Transmissions and their commitment to clean up and fell only the most severely damaged trees. I hope you feel that you can do more than just listen? It has been 20 months since the tree felling program started on Braemar and to the west. Notices were posted on the access trails to say about 142 trees which are damaged or pose a threat to the Hydro lines would be dropped. And at least 142 trees were dropped, some being more than 24 inches diameter. They made sure that the logs were sawn through if they blocked a trail, but still today, the trees lay, waiting to wrot. Not a single one was salvaged, even though there is road access. They lie in a jumbled mess. Why? The district has not made them clean up the logs. They are not needed to replenish the soil.!
